IMPROVING ACCESS TO CARE

To help address the state's mental health workforce shortage, Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Montana (BCBSMT) invested \$70,000 in the Rural Behavioral Health Institute. The organization's bridge psychiatric care model uses a network of trained health clinicians, case managers and providers who ensure students receive proper mental health support or treatment. By the close of the 2022-23 school year, more than 20,000 students across 36 counties will have received the suicide prevention screening intervention.

For the first time since 2019, it was a full Governor's Cup experience, with the return of the wildly popular Kids Marathon and Mile Fun Run on June 10 at Centennial Park.
